

Great Backyard Bird Count

The National Audubon Society & Cornell Lab of Ornithology needs every bird enthusiast in North America to count birds February 17th-20th. All you need is a basic knowledge of bird identification! This activity is extremely easy...you watch the birds in your yard, local park, or other natural area for 15 minutes or more and use a tally sheet to record the highest number of individual birds that you see in view at one time. There are two ways to participate in the bird count, 1. Call the Conservation Board at 712-769-2372 and we will send you everything you need or (you may pick it up in our office) 2. You can visit the Great Backyard Bird Count website at http://gbbc.birdcount.org/ and submit your results from there. This is a great family event and the data collected will be used by scientists to analyze bird populations. If you are new to the count please see the Upcoming Programs on the next page. Since 2002 the Cass County Conservation Board has advertised this bird count throughout the county encouraging citizens to participate. Last year Cass County Birders lagged behind in the State...but all county numbers were low last year. We only had 28 checklists. We ended up holding on to the 10th place, in terms of checklists. Dallas County (Adel) had 1st place this year with 101 checklists, with Johnson county at their heels with 87 checklists! Linn county was 3rd, Woodbury county was 4th, and Polk fell to 6th with 52 checklists. We were the ONLY top ten county with less than 50,000 in population! I think we can double our number and secure a top 5 showing in 2017! With the new eBird system the record keeping is by county so I can not really tell you anymore the species reported for each town, but Cass county as a whole. Iowa as a whole had 102 species reported and 971 checklists which is back In this Issue: closer to our Iowa average! United States reported 676 species and 118,000 checklists. Typically participants submit Great Backyard Bird Count their checklists on the internet, however, for those that are Cont. on page 2... not comfortable using computers, the Conservation Board collects the data and enters the checklists for them. The Conservation Board also visits the Atlantic High School each Upcoming Events year to encourage students to participate in the count. Let's get out there this year get back in the top 5!! At the time of this printing, we had 150 Trumpeter Swans are over-wintering at Schildberg Recreation Area-Lake 4. We haven't had any collared swans yet this year. We've have had our highest EVER recorded number of Trumpeter Swans on 12/28/16 at 150!!! Before this our record was 79 in one day. The swan's official date of arrival was November 19th. Our swan Contest winner is Jane Kite! The school contest was won by Mrs. Haynes's three year old Morning Preschool at Jack and Jill Preschool!
