WHEREAS, only counties that have adopted a construction evaluation resolution and submitted an adopted recommendation may contest the DNR's decision regarding a specific application; and

WHEREAS, by adopting a construction evaluation resolution the board of supervisors agrees to evaluate every construction permit application for a proposed confinement feeding operation structure received by the board of supervisors between February 1, 2004 and January 31, 2005 and submit an adopted recommendation regarding that application to the DNR; and

WHEREAS, the board of supervisors must conduct an evaluation of every construction permit application using the master matrix created in Iowa Code section 459.305, but the board's recommendation to the DNR may be based on the final score on the master matrix or may be based on reasons other than the final score on the master matrix;

NOW, THEREFORE, upon motion by Waters, second by Rieken: BE IT RESOLVED that the Cass County Board of Supervisors hereby adopts this construction evaluation resolution pursuant to Iowa Code section 459.304(3). Carried unanimously.

The board authorized Mr. Arnold and Mary McMartin of Rogers Benefit Group to solicit information via a GROUP INSURANCE EMPLOYEE ENROLLMENT FORM from all medical insurance eligible employees with the objective to secure rate proposals from both Principal and Fortis.

"Shall Ordinance No. 2004-01, as printed below, conveying water utility properties and indebtedness to and granting to Southern Iowa Rural Water Association, a non-exclusive franchise to acquire, construct, reconstruct, operate, repair, remove, replace and maintain the water distribution system within the City of Massena, Iowa, be approved?"

ORDINANCE NO. 2004-01

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING TO THE SOUTHERN IOWA RURAL WATER ASSOCIATION, STATE OF IOWA, THE RIGHT AND NONEXCLUSIVE FRANCHISE TO ACQUIRE THE WATER UTILITY PROPERTIES OF THE CITY OF MASSENA, CASS COUNTY, IOWA, AND THEREAFTER TO MAINTAIN, OPERATE, REPAIR, REMOVE, REPLACE, RENEW AND RECONSTRUCT A WATER TREATMENT, STORAGE AND DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM AND APPURTENANCES AND THE RIGHT TO OPERATE, REPAIR, REPLACE AND MAINTAIN THE NECESSARY MAINS, PUMPS, METERS AND METER PITS AND OTHER APPLIANCES UNDER THE STREETS, AVENUES, ALLEYS, AND PUBLIC PLACES IN THE CITY OF MASSENA, CASS COUNTY, IOWA, AND THE RIGHT TO SUPPLY AND SELL TO INDIVIDUALS, CORPORATIONS, COMMUNITIES AND MUNICIPALITIES BOTH INSIDE AND OUTSIDE OF SAID CITY, TREATED WATER FOR THE PERIOD OF 40 YEARS PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 28E OF THE CODE OF IOWA (2003), AND PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION OF SUCH ACTIVITY. Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Massena, Iowa that:

ARTICLE ONE- PURPOSE

The purpose of this Ordinance is to set forth the terms and conditions of an agreement hereby made pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 28E of the Code of Iowa as a contract between two public entities, namely the City of Massena, Cass County, Iowa, hereinafter referred to as "Grantor" or the "City," and the Southern Iowa Rural Water Association, State of Iowa (an Iowa Code Chapter 357A Rural Water District), hereinafter referred to as "Grantee" or "SIRWA," for the co-operative operation, maintenance, repair, reconstruction and replacement of a public improvement, namely a water distribution system within the City of Massena, Iowa. ARTICLE TWO- GRANT OF FRANCHISE

The Grantor hereby grants to Grantee, its successors and assigns a nonexclusive franchise to acquire the City of Massena=s water treatment, storage and distribution system and thereafter to maintain, operate, repair, replace, dismantle, recycle, salvage, renew, reconstruct, and remove a water distribution system across public property in the City in accordance with the laws and regulations of the United States of America, the State of Iowa, and the rules and regulations of the Grantee, including the non-exclusive right, privilege and authority to (a) sell and supply treated water to individuals, corporations, communities and municipalities both inside and outside said City; (b) to use public property within the City; (c) to engage in such further activities within the City as may now or hereinafter be consistent with the accepted principles applicable to the operation of a water distribution system.

For the purpose of carrying into effect the privileges granted hereunder, Grantee is authorized to make all necessary excavations in the streets, alleys, sidewalks, and public grounds within the corporate limits of Grantor, but such excavations shall be carried out with reasonable dispatch and with as little interference with or

inconvenience to the rights of the public as may be feasible. Grantee shall restore all streets, alleys, sidewalks, and public grounds to the condition of safety, appearance and utility specified by the relevant construction industry standards after excavation.

ARTICLE THREE- TERM

The franchise is granted for an initial term of forty (40) years commencing with the date of adoption of this Ordinance, provided, however, that Grantor may not withdraw from this agreement as long as Grantee shall have revenue bond obligations incurred for the construction, reconstruction or maintenance of said water distribution system outstanding at that time, as provided in Section 28E.4, Code of Iowa. Thereafter, the franchise may be renewed for an additional term upon such terms and conditions as may be mutually acceptable to Grantor and Grantee.

ARTICLE FOUR- FINANCING AND BUDGET

Initial funding of this joint undertaking shall be from revenues of the water utility, the existing water utility account and accounts receivable of the Grantor and from loans, grants, revenue bonds or notes obtained by Grantee, including Grantee=s assumption of Grantor's water utility debt.

Said revenue bonds or notes shall mature in a period not to exceed forty years from the date of issuance, shall bear interest or combined interest and insurance charges, at a rate not to exceed that permitted by Chapter 74A, Code of Iowa, shall be payable only from revenue derived from the sale of treated water by the Grantee, and shall never become or be construed to be a debt against the State of Iowa, Cass County or the City of Massena.

Grantee shall have the responsibility for budgeting and administration of construction and operation of the water system.

ARTICLE FIVE- GENERAL CONDITIONS

Section 1. Adoption of Rules and Regulations. Grantor hereby adopts and incorporates by reference the rules and regulations of the Grantee pertaining to construction, installation, repair, maintenance, and operation of the system.

Section 2. Enforcement of Mandatory Connection Ordinances. Grantor shall be responsible for enforcement of its ordinances relative to mandatory connection to the water utility. However, this authority shall not preclude Grantee from exercising any remedies available to it in enforcing its rights under this franchise agreement in law or equity.

Section 3. Additions to Area of Grantor. Grantee shall, on subsequent additions of areas to Grantor, either by annexation, consolidation, or otherwise, surrender all franchises held by Grantee in such areas, such surrender being deemed to take place on the occurrence of any such event. Grantee shall thereafter be subject to the provisions of the franchise granted by this ordinance as to all such areas; provided, however, that should the franchise be declared invalid or rendered inoperative by a judgment, decree, or order of a court of competent jurisdiction which, being binding hereon, becomes final for all purposes. The franchises hereby surrendered shall thereafter have the same force and effect as if such surrender had not occurred.

Section 4. Expansion of Grantee's Facilities. Any facilities and appurtenances in streets, alleys, and public places, incidental to the franchised system that have been, or are at any future time acquired, leased, or utilized in any manner by Grantee are thereupon to be deemed authorized by and shall be subject to all the provisions of the franchise.

Section 5. Limitation of Franchise. No privilege or exemption is granted or conferred by the franchise except those specifically prescribed herein. Any privilege claimed under the franchise by Grantee in any street, alley, or other public place shall be subordinate to any lawful occupancy of same by Grantor or by any other public agency, and to prior lawful occupancy of same by any other entity or person.

Section 6. Grantee's Separate Powers Not Limited. Notwithstanding the foregoing limitations, nothing in this agreement shall be deemed a limitation of Grantee's separate powers as set forth in Section 357A.11 of the Code of lowa or any other relevant provision of the Code of lowa and other applicable law.

ARTICLE SIX- ASSIGNMENT OF FRANCHISE

Grantee shall not have the right to sell or lease the franchise within a two mile radius of the City of Massena, except on prior written approval by ordinance of the City Council of Massena.

This Article shall not be deemed a limitation upon the Grantee's power and authority to pledge revenues derived from the franchise or assets of the distribution system acquired under this agreement as collateral with the United States of America, acting through Rural Development (formerly the Farmers Home Administration), its successor agencies or any other lender.

Grantee does, in fact, hereby pledge and assign to the United States of America, acting through Rural Development and its successor agencies its rights under this contract as additional collateral. ARTICLE SEVEN- FORFEITURE

The franchise may be forfeited, at the option of the Grantor, upon failure or refusal by Grantee to observe the terms and conditions set forth herein. Forfeiture may be exercised by written notice to Grantee of failure to observe the terms and conditions hereof, followed by Grantee's refusal to eliminate or correct such failure or violation within one year. In the event of any failure or violation, Grantor may sue in its own name in the manner provided by law for the forfeiture of the franchise and the exercise of such remedy of forfeiture shall not preclude

exercise of any other right or remedy given to Grantor by law, whether exercised concurrently or subsequently. ARTICLE EIGHT- SEVERABILITY

If any section, provision or part of this agreement shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the agreement as a whole, or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

ARTICLE NINE- REPEALER

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

FY0304 budget reviewed. Engineer Charles Marker stated that a DOT budget amendment was required due to change of over 10% in certain service areas. Board set May 28 for county budget amendment hearing. Other departmental budgets were reviewed.

FY0405 appropriations reviewed. Motion by Kinen, second by Volk: Appropriations for the departments of Sheriff and Jail shall be made monthly with each month's appropriation not to exceed 1/12th of the annual budget unless authorized by the Board of Supervisors. The Sheriff shall not encumber any county funds in excess of the appropriation.

B.O.S. discussed whether graduated appropriations were necessary. Kinen thought it proper in order to insure that the incoming officer will have equal funding for the one half of fiscal year that the new official will be Sheriff. Further discussion ensued on whether a separate motion was needed or whether regular appropriation resolution was sufficient. Motion by Joyce, second by Rieken to postpone vote on motion until May 12.

Carried unanimously.

By consensus May 12, 2004 was set as date to act on FY0405 appropriations (usually done late June).

Conservation director Dennis Sierck and naturalist Andria Cossolotto brought a stuffed bobcat to the boardroom and presented an estimate they had received to construct a display case that could be placed on courthouse first floor to house the bobcat and other mounted wildlife belonging to the county. The board requested that additional proposals be gotten. Where to place the case and safety issues concerning placement of the case were discussed.

The Cass County Board of Supervisors met with all members present: Chair Don Volk; Russell Joyce, Chuck Kinen, Charles Rieken and Kenneth Waters. The minutes of June 15, 2004 were approved as read.

County Attorney James Barry reviewed current legal activity. Report items: Mid American Energy easement across drainage district property and underwater rescue and recovery dive team in regard to status as 'arm' of EMA or another governmental body.

Whereas, the State of Iowa has appropriated moneys for fiscal year 07/01/2004 through 06/30/2005,

And, whereas said moneys are insufficient to fund the various local property tax credits/exemptions fully,

And, whereas, Iowa Code Section 25B.7 requires local governments to extend to the taxpayers only those portions of the property tax credits/exemptions that are estimated by the Iowa Department of Revenue to be funded by the state appropriation,

And, whereas the Iowa Department of Revenue has estimated the percentages of funding for the affected property tax credits/exemptions as follows: Homestead credit 81%, Elderly/Disabled Low-income Credit 100% and Military Exemption credit 100%,

And, whereas the option of fully funding the homestead property tax credit will cause a funding shortfall to local governments in the County of more than \$170,000 this fiscal year,

Wednesday, June 23, 2004 (continued)

And whereas the option of passing on the reduced state-reimbursed values of the credits will increase the amount of net taxes in the County by more than \$170,000 per year,

Motion by Waters, second by Rieken: Pursuant to Iowa Code Section 25B.7 the homestead property tax credit in Cass County for taxes collectible in fiscal year July 1, 2004 through June 30, 2005 shall be funded at 81%. Carried unanimously.

MH/DD/GR Coordinator Teresa Kanning reviewed departmental activity. Received letter dated 6/9 from State program director indicating state was not honoring rate increases negotiated locally. Iowa City hospital papers being certified for new fiscal year. Board consensus was to not apply for FEMA monies for MH assistance.

County Engineer Charles Marker reviewed current road projects.

Contractor will be hauling approximately 40,000 cubic yards of 'dirt' over county roads. Dust control agents have been applied on sections of haul roads and near Lewis. FEMA funds is available for minor damage at five county sites- two culverts and three bridges (debris).

Bids for two motor graders had been received from Murphy Tractor (John Deere 770CH) with net cost after trade-in of \$179,940; bid from Spreitzer (Volvo) did not meet specifications; and Ziegler (Cat 140H) with net cost after trade-in of \$249,164. Board recessed to 'Anita' county shed to examine John Deere grader on site. Board will research lifetime operation costs before making decision.

Committee reports- Joyce: Boost 4-Families 6/15 (Red Oak), Golden Hills RC&D 6/18 (Oakland), CADCO and Southwest Iowa Coalition 6/20; and Kinen: Emergency Management Agency and 911 Service Board 6/14.

Reports filed: Dr. Tressa Wilcox submitted a letter of resignation from the Cass County Board of Health effective June 30, 2004.

Chair adjourned meeting. Next meeting Wednesday, June 30, 2004.

Wednesday, June 30, 2004

The Cass County Board of Supervisors met with all members present: Don Volk, Chair; Chuck Kinen, Russell Joyce, Charles Rieken and Kenneth Waters. The minutes of June 23, 2003 were approved as read.

County Attorney James Barry reviewed current legal activity. Fee for Mid American Energy easement over drainage district property researched. Customary easement fee is \$1,000 over any span without poles.

Regional Water Association General Manager Jade Willcoxon (accompanied by project coordinator Eric Jones) presented information on the project which will include provision of rural water to about a five square mile area of Cass County including sites near the Hwy 71/I-80 intersection. Representatives here to provide county attorney with copies of legal papers required and to note that an ordinance directing capping of "for human consumption" current wells and prohibition of new wells "for human consumption" needs to be passed to facilitate the project. All construction and connection costs for the Cass County portion of the project may be funded by the Iowa Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund. Agreements for usage would require a five year commitment and monthly usage fees would be the responsibility of the consumer.

Wednesday, June 30, 2004 (continued)

"Special investigation of the Cass County Sheriff's office, July 1, 2001 through February 25, 2004" was released at 8 A.M. today.

About 9:20 A.M. Chair Don Volk made the following statement: The above "The audit report was released this morning. It speaks for itself. It will be passed on to the attorney general's office, DCI and the county attorney's office. Any further action will be coming from them.

Elected officials run their offices. The Board of Supervisors only controls a limited amount of this. Only under extreme circumstances can any elected official be removed from office: a proven criminal offense, by election or by resignation. We regret any problems that have come up in any office and will do all we can to pursue solutions to the problems. The audit is only an audit and is step one to any further action. It would be inappropriate for us to go into details at this time. Everything we know is in this report, and the County asked the State for this audit."

Motion by Kinen, second by Waters to appoint Dr. Robert Beck, Atlantic to the vacancy term (ending 12/31/2005) on the Cass County Board of Health. Carried unanimously.

MH/DD/GR Coordinator Teresa Kanning reviewed departmental activity. Nine Iowa City 'papers' have been processed, 2 on hold and 8 clients with FY04 papers have not replied. Two client cases considered. Board consensus to approve each for one time only.

County Engineer Charles Marker reviewed current road projects.

Motion by Joyce, second by Rieken to designate Cass County Engineer Charles M. Marker, PE as applicant's authorized representative to sign and file documents with Iowa Homeland Security and Emergency Management Division for the purpose of obtaining Federal & State assistance under the Disaster Relief Act(PL93-288, as amended) or otherwise available from the President's Disaster Relief Fund and the Code of Iowa, Chapter 29C. Carried unanimously.

Discussion on bids for motor graders. Information on auction sales of Cat and John Deere graders was gotten. Machinery Trader results showed on average that Cat graders (6 and 7 year old) brought \$43,000 more in 2004 and \$50,500 in 2003 than did John Deere. Comment: appears county could recoup additional original cost at time of trade in. Board also commented on factors of stocking parts for multiple type machines; ease and speed of procurement of parts; dependability/reliability of machines; etc.

Motion by Waters, second by Joyce to accept the bid of Ziegler for two Cat model 140H (in stock) motor graders with added lift group at \$175,521 each with trade in of two used motor graders (\$104,000). Resultant cash outlay: \$247,042. Carried unanimously.

WHEREAS, notice of a hearing for today was published in the Atlantic News Telegraph on July 2, 2004, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has duly considered the plan;

NOW upon motion by Waters, second by Kinen: **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CASS COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS** that this Board approve and adopt the comprehensive Plan Report, Cass County, Iowa dated December, 2003, prepared by RDG Planning & Design as set out in the attached report and amendments thereto, (subject to clarification of definition of exclusive agricultural referenced on Map 2-2) and that the Chairperson of the Board be instructed to execute the appropriate certificates thereon; and be it further

RESOLVED that said Comprehensive Plan Report is adopted as a guide to the immediate and long-range growth of Cass County, Iowa, and that the Policy Statements and the General Land Use Plan contained therein are specifically adopted and approved as the principle elements of said Plan;

Steve Jacobs commended the county for dust control on a haul road. He also commented that he was interested in the issue of rural water and commented that he had to drill a new well a couple of years past at a cost of approximately \$12,000.

Jeffrey Kirchhoff commented that it would be advisable to check on type of pipe used through a contaminated site (mentioned ductile iron pipe or liner to prevent infiltration of contaminants). He also made inquiries regarding items reported in the special audit of the sheriff's department.

Other items discussed: (1) Heating system and replacement of valves on all radiators and relocation of temperature sensors throughout the courthouse. Estimate of cost received from Carroll Control Systems Inc. Rieken and Joyce suggested the solicitation of estimates from other vendors. (2) Replacement of floor covering in jail hallways. Inmate(s) caused backup of drain. Carpet ruined and removed. Consensus was not to replace rug. Alternative floor coverings include tile for about \$1,940 (prep, tile and cove); ceramic tile (about \$5,280); and layered vinyl (\$2,920 up). Consensus was to go with lower cost alternative. Also it was decided to check with ICAP on whether loss covered by insurance and to research whether inmate could be held liable for cost of replacement.

Dale and Verlene Larsen commented they were concerned about the sheriff and other situations asking the questions: Where are the checks and balances? They asked specifically about credit card usage and policy and the process of review of individual claims. They also questioned why suspension from position had not taken place. Their comments were taken under advisement.

PUBLIC MEASURE A

Summary: To authorize imposition of a 1% local sales and services tax in the County of Cass for school infrastructure projects for 10 years, from January 1, 2005 to December 31, 2014.

A local sales and services tax for school infrastructure projects shall be imposed in the county of Cass at the rate of one percent (1%). The tax will begin January 1, 2005. The tax will be in effect for a period of ten years until December 31, 2014.

The revenue generated by the Cass County School Infrastructure Local Option Sales and Services Tax is to be spent as follows:

In the ANITA, ATLANTIC, C&M, ELK HORN-KIMBALLTON, EXIRA, GRISWOLD and WALNUT COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICTS:

The money received from the tax will be expended for school infrastructure purposes and needs of school districts and/or property tax relief as now or hereafter authorized by the Code of Iowa. Such school infrastructure purposes include but are not necessarily limited to the construction, reconstruction, repair, purchasing, or remodeling of schoolhouses, stadiums, gyms, field houses, and bus garages and the procurement of school house construction sites, the making of site improvements, demolition work and for equipment, transportation equipment, and public recreation or other activities for which revenues under Iowa Code sections 298.3 or 300.2 may be spent, i.e. the physical plant and equipment tax levy and the public educational and recreational tax levy. Additionally, "school infrastructure" includes the payment or retirement of outstanding bonds previously issued for school infrastructure purposes and the payment or retirement of bonds issued for school infrastructure purposes under section 422E.4, Code of Iowa. there were <u>one thousand three hundred forty-six</u> (1,346) votes cast as follows: For the question, there were <u>eight hundred sixty-two</u> (862) votes.

Against the question, there were four hundred eighty-four (484) votes.

We therefore declare the public measure to be adopted.

The auditor was authorized to prepare the abstract and submit a copy to the Iowa Department of Revenue and to apportion the election costs "among the school districts on a pro rata basis in proportion to the number of registered voters in each school district who reside within Cass County and the total number of registered voters within the county." -IOWA CODE 422E.2 (5.b.) An "ordinance of a county board of supervisors imposing a local sales and services tax shall" be adopted and "A certified copy of the ordinance shall be filed with the director as soon as possible after passage." - IOWA CODE 422B.9 (2.b.) Public hearings for ordinance set for September 8th and 15th.

The Cass County Board of Supervisors met with four members present: Don Volk, Chair; Russell Joyce, Charles Rieken and Kenneth Waters. Absent: Chuck Kinen. The minutes of August 31 were approved as read.

At 9:00 A.M. as published a hearing was held on a request to amend classification from Business to Light Industrial for a tract of land in the SW $\frac{1}{100}$ NW $\frac{1}{100}$ of Section 4 of Pymosa Township.

No objections submitted to the board either orally or in writing.

Notices of the hearing were published between 4 and 20 days prior to hearing.

Present were the petitioner, the Board and the County Auditor.

Motion by Waters with second by Joyce: The Cass County Board of Supervisors concurs with the recommendation of the Cass County Zoning Commission and approves change in zoning from Business District to Light Industrial District for property described as: A tract of land in the SW¼ of the NW^{$\frac{1}{4}$} of Section 4-77-36, West of the 5th P.M., Cass County, Iowa, more particularly described as follows: Commencing at the SW Corner of said SW¼ of the NW¼, thence due North along the West side of said SW¼ of the NW¼ a distance of 1,038.40 feet, thence due East a distance of 53.15 feet, to a point on Interstate Highway No. 80 right-of-way as the point of beginning; thence continuing due East a distance of 337.35 feet, thence due South and parallel with the West side of said SW¼ of the NW¼, a distance of 511.57 feet to a point on the North right-of-way line of Interstate 80, thence North 60°15'W along said right-of-way line a distance of 220.0 feet, thence North 39°23'W along said right-of-way line a distance of 196.40 feet, thence North 4°58'W along said right-of-way line a distance of 251.40 feet to the point of beginning. "Ordinance No. 21 ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A SCHOOL INFRA-STRUCTURE LOCAL OPTION SALES AND SERVICES TAX

Be It Enacted by the Board of Supervisors of Cass County, Iowa:

Section 1. <u>School Infra-Structure Local Option Sales and Services</u> <u>Tax.</u> There is imposed a School Infra-Structure local option sales and services tax applicable to transactions within Cass County, Iowa.

Wednesday, September 15, 2004 (continued)

The rate of the tax shall be one (1) percent upon the gross receipts taxed under Iowa Code chapter 422E-School Local Option Tax, in the following: ANITA, ATLANTIC, C & M, ELK HORN-KIMBALLTON, EXIRA, GRISWOLD and WALNUT COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICTS of Cass County, Iowa.

The School Infra-Structure local sales services tax is imposed on transactions occurring on or after January 1, 2005 within Cass County. All persons required to collect state gross receipts taxes shall collect the tax pursuant to Iowa Code section 422E.3 for school infrastructure local option sales and services tax.

All applicable provisions of the appropriate sections of Chapter 422, Division IV, of the Iowa Code are adopted by reference.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

Section 3. <u>Severability Clause</u>. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provisions or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional. "

NOW BE IT RESOLVED that the position of Cass County attorney is hereby changed to a part-time position, with an initial annual salary of \$60,000. This resolution will take effect 60 days from adoption, or sooner if a written agreement to that effect is reached with the county attorney. Carried unanimously.

The Co. Auditor noted that no written or oral comments had been received prior to the hearing. Co. Attorney requested clarification of the grant terms and program. M.J. Broomfield explained.

After due consideration, motion by Waters, second by Kinen to adopt RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CHAIR TO MAKE AN APPLICATION TO THE FY2005 IOWA HOUSING FUND PROGRAM FOR ASSISTANCE TO COMPLETE THE CASS COUNTY HOUSING REHABILITATION PROGRAM. Carried unanimously. Hearing closed 9:29 A.M.

County Attorney Daniel Feistner reviewed current legal activity. Record storage, no order of charges for sheriff and attorney litigation yet, hearing in regard to McGuire zoning change request pending and work for city among items discussed.

MH/DD/GR Coordinator Teresa Kanning reviewed departmental activity. Requested authorization to purchase envelopes using credit card: authorization given.

County Engineer Charles Marker reviewed departmental activity. CASS COUNTY Resolution # 2004-12-30-01

Resolution Establishing Road as Area Service 'C'

WHEREAS, Cass County, Iowa County desires to classify a certain road on the area service system in the County to provide for a minimal level of maintenance and access by means of a gate or barrier; and

WHEREAS, the County, after consultation with the County Engineer, has the authority to specify a certain road within the County as Area Service 'C' roads pursuant to Iowa Code Section 309.57; and

WHEREAS, the only persons who will have access rights to the roads shall be: 1. The owner, lessee, or person in lawful possession of any adjoining land, 2. The agent or employee of the owner, lessee or person in lawful possession of any adjoining land,

3. Any peace officer,

4. Any magistrate,

5. Any public employee whose duty it is to supervise the use or perform maintenance of the road,

6. Any agent or employee of any utility located upon the road.

WHEREAS, the minimal level of maintenance will be as follows:

1. <u>Blading</u>. Blading or dragging will not be performed on a regular basis.

2. <u>Snow and Ice Removal</u>. Snow and ice will not be removed, nor will the road surface be sanded or salted on a regular basis.

3. <u>Signing</u> . Except for load limit posting for bridges, signing shall not be continued or provided. <u>ALL AREA SERVICE LEVEL C ROADS SHALL BE IDENTIFIED WITH A SIGN</u> AT ALL POINTS OF ACCESS TO WARN THE PUBLIC OF THE LOWER LEVEL OF MAINTENANCE,

4. <u>Weeds</u>. Brush and Trees. Mowing or spraying weeds, cutting brush and tree removal will not be performed on a regular basis. Adequate sight distances will not be maintained.

5. <u>Structures</u>. Bridges and culverts may not be maintained to carry legal loads. Upon failure or loss, the replacement structure will be appropriate for the traffic thereon.

6. <u>Road Surfacing</u>. There will be no surfacing materials applied to Area Service System B Roads on a regular basis.

7. Shoulders. Shoulders will not be maintained on a regular basis.

8. Crown. A crown will not be maintained on a regular basis.

9. <u>Repairs</u>. There will be no road repair on a regular basis.

10. Uniform Width. Uniform width for the traveled portion of the road will not be maintained.

11. Inspections . Regular inspections will not be conducted.

THEREFORE, upon motion by Rieken, second by Kinen: BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF CASS COUNTY that this County does hereby establish the road described as an Area Service 'C' road, with restricted access and a minimal level of maintenance:

655th Street beginning ¼ mile north of State Highway 83, thence North ¼ mile to Galveston Road.

The legal description being: that part of Road #58 of 1876 beginning at the East Quarter Corner of the Southwest Quarter, North to the Center of the Section, all in Section 1, Township 76 North, Range 36 West.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Ayes: Kinen, Rieken and Volk. Nayes: Waters. Motion Carried.
