Results of 2018 Great Backyard Bird Count

Overall it was a great year for Iowa in the Great Backyard Bird Count (GBBC). The Cass County Birders are 1st in the State! Iowa overall was lower in species and in checklists happening, but our fantastic showing of 87 checklists far surpassed 2nd place Story county with 63 and Johnson County 62 checklists and with Des Moines/Polk at their heels! Story, Polk, Johnson, and Scott beat us in the species count. With the new eBird system the record keeping is by county so I can not really tell you anymore the species reported for each town unless we record them, but Cass county as a whole. Iowa as a whole had 103 species reported and 780 checklists! United States reported 659 species and 110,151 checklists. The GBBC is a global bird count sponsored by the National Audubon Society and Cornell Lab of Ornithology, globally 6,310 species and 176,905 checklists. Since 2002 the Cass County Conservation Board has advertised this bird count throughout the county encouraging citizens to participate. Typically participants submit their checklists on the internet, however, for those that are not comfortable using computers, the Conservation Board collects the data and enters the checklists for them.
