Trumpeter Swans in Cass County

Fifty-two Trumpeter Swans were over-wintering at the Schildberg Quarry in northwest Atlantic on 1/15/13. Two of them are marked (with red or green collars), making it possible to keep track of their travels. Both of the marked swans have previously over-wintered at Schildberg Quarry. Our highest number of swans for the year is 60 on 1/5/13. The LAST handful of 5th annual Soiree with the Swans long sleeved t-shirts are still for sale, <u>Marked down XL \$10 and 2XL/3XL are \$10</u>, Stop at our office and pick one up TODAY!! The swans arrival was Nov 24th.

5C5 is a male from West Bend, IA. He has been coming to the Schildberg quarry for eight winters now.5H5, a male of Blaine Behnken's captive pair, after being released at Lake Anita on 4/6/05. He has been here for seven winters now in Atlantic, IA, their nest site is unknown.

Our Swan Contest winner <u>Alice Brown (November 24!)</u> and for the School Contest <u>Mrs. Christensen's 3rd</u> <u>grade class</u> at Washington Elementary had the closest date!

Great Backyard Bird Count

The National Audubon Society & Cornell Lab of Ornithology needs every bird enthusiast in North America to count birds February 15th-18th. All you need is a basic knowledge of bird identification! This activity is extremely easy...you watch the birds in your yard, local park, or other natural area for 15 minutes or more and use a tally sheet to record the highest number of individual birds that you see in view at one time. There are two ways to participate in the bird count, 1. Call the Conservation Board at 712-769-2372 and we will send you everything you need or (you may pick it up in our office) 2. You can visit the Great Backyard Bird Count website at http://www.birdsource.org/gbbc and submit your results from there. This is a great family event and the data collected will be used by scientists to analyze bird populations. Since 2002 the Cass County Conservation Board has advertised this bird count throughout the county encouraging citizens to participate. Last year we had a strong second place finish behind Adel at 102, we were only up one checklist from last year, tell your friends! We were not the highest number of species recorded by a town overall but a strong showing beating Adel by **ONE** species! Also the difference between us and 3rd place was <u>only</u> 6 checklists (Des Moines was 3rd.) Congratulations Cass County on a wonderful response! Blast from the Past

Since it is a special birthday this year (#55 if you were not counting) we thought it would be fantastic to go back to the First edition of the Conservation Quarterly-spring 1989, and reprint an article. We found some things that are still the same! Some things the same: Wildflower hike, summer camps, and our classic listing of employees and board members. One article of interest was the Chickadee checkoff as follows. It's tax time again. The time of the year when many cringe at the thought of plowing through all those tax forms. Believe it or not, there is some good that comes out of our taxes. The Iowa tax form has a line marked "chickadee checkoff", and funds received from this line solely fund the Iowa Nongame Program. Since it began in 1982, it has enabled over 51,000 people to learn more about our nongame species through talks and workshops. The Iowa Nongame Program has provided funding for many research projects and for land acquisition. They have reintroduced the river otter to Iowa, and are currently working to restore the Peregrine Falcon's numbers to Iowa. The Nongame Program cares for and about the nongame species in Iowa. Show them you care too by checking the Chickadee Checkoff on your tax form!

This program in most recent years funds our Trumpeter Swans! Other current projects are Osprey, Prairie Chickens, and still the Peregrine Falcon's. It is also now listed as 58a. Fish/Wildlife on the form.
