
# 5th Biennial Lighted Halloween Campground



We take reservations for our Outdoor Educational Classroom Lodge for meetings and events through the winter as we do keep it plowed. Please contact the office if you are interested in reserving. Trumpeter Swans have visited the Schildberg Quarry for, at least, Nineteen out of the last Twenty winters. Most Trumpeter Swans migrate farther south for the winter in search of open water and food. Because of the depth of Atlantic's Schildberg Quarry, and the large number of wading waterfowl, it remains open year round, making it possible for the swans to stay. We had NO deaths last year!!!! Last season we had an average of 48 visit, and the most on one day was 84! We also had one swan from Wisconsin visit. Arrival and departure dates of the Trumpeter Swans have been as follows:
