

LEGAL NOTICE

On December 30, 2021 the Cass County Temporary Redistricting Commission adopted a supervisor redistricting plan wherein the variation between supervisor district populations is more than 1% from the ideal population of 2,625 for two of the five districts. Whereas supervisor districts must follow township and city boundaries as much as possible, and if it must split a township, must follow roadway boundaries, the Commission adopted this plan because it splits only one township and follows roadway boundaries which produced the result of a variation slightly over 1%. The other variation results due to the city of Atlantic having more than one half the total county population. There are five wards, so two wards each must comprise a supervisor district and the fifth ward must be part of a third supervisor district. The fifth ward had to have a larger population and vary in ideal population by no more than 10%. Making that ward meet the less than 10% variation left more in the other two supervisor districts (composed of two wards each) than could result in one of the other supervisor districts varying by less than 1%.
