> Getting Ready for Spring in our parks

Spring has arrived in Cass County, even though the weather can't seem to make up its mind. As of this writing we are getting very close to the annual spring turkey season with the youth season kicking things off on Friday April 11th, with the four other regular seasons following. We are seeing a few folks out fishing on the nicer days here at Cold Springs. The pond at the Outdoor Classroom is in its first spring since being renovated so fishing there won't have much too offer until later this fall. Fishing will only improve as we move through April and May. Another spring ritual that should be happening any time now is Morel mushroom hunting time. We advise if you are looking for mushrooms on land that folks may also be turkey hunting to wear blaze orange to avoid any possible accidents. The campground at Cold Springs is open and ready for you to come stay with us and enjoy the beautiful oak and hickory trees as they start to leaf out for the year. Some exciting news for Cold Springs is that we have begun working on a new restroom facility that will be located at the beach area of the park, it should be open later this year. Our Standup Paddleboard programs will return this year they will be on the last Saturday of every month (exception of July), Ending Labor Day Weekend with that Saturday Aug. 30th. We only have 5 currently, so you must preregister for your spot! To register, call 769-2372, or email to sign up lkanning@casscoia.us. Anyone under 16 must have a parent with them at all times. During the date/times listed for standup paddleboards we will have our new Kayaks available for checkout. You may reserve a spot ahead of time by calling, emailing, or reserving on-line! We are excited to expand our watersport offerings here in Cass County! These 4 sit in kayaks and 4 sit on top kayaks are reservable through our my county parks website, in 1.5 hr time blocks. We have a frequent camper card program- ask our staff! Camping coupon books are now available! \$150 for 11 nights of camping at Cold Springs Park good until Oct 31, 2026. Making Shelter Reservations- To reserve the shelter at Cold Springs Park contact Ryan Lockwood at 769-2372. Don't forget we take reservations for our Outdoor Educational Classroom Lodge for meetings and events. Please contact the office if you are interested in reserving. Inside this newsletter is our Native Plant sale, we've added some different species for your consideration. The Canada geese are beginning to nest on most of the bodies of water and I'm hearing wood ducks every day at Cold Springs and the Outdoor Classroom. The Trumpeter Swans that live near the Outdoor Classroom have returned to nest for another year as well. Results of 2025 Great Backyard Bird Count

Overall, it was a momentous year for Iowa in the Great Backyard Bird Count (GBBC). It was a strong year for species, but the checklists overall were lower in Iowa. Our results showed that, we had the lowest species count we've seen in recent years, but had a strong showing of 57 checklists. That put us at 5th in the STATE!! We held our own with got beat out by the largest counties in the state: Polk, Story, Johnson, and Woodbury with Dubuque at our heels, and Dallas County in 10th place. Our species count was 26, when we do the Christmas Bird Count our average species count is 32. With the new eBird system the record keeping is by county so I cannot really tell you anymore the species reported for each town unless we record them, but Cass County as a whole. Iowa had 103 species reported and 932 checklists! United States reported 671 species and 164,600 checklists.

The GBBC is a global bird count sponsored by the National Audubon Society and Cornell Lab of Ornithology. Collectively, we found 8,078 species of birds—over 2/3'rds of the known 10,960 species we share the planet with. More than 217 countries came together to share bird sightings, making our global submission map light up for four consecutive days. Since 2002 the Cass County Conservation Board has advertised this bird count throughout the county encouraging citizens to participate. Typically, participants submit their checklists on the internet, however, for those that are not comfortable using computers, the Conservation Board collects the data and enters the checklists for them. You can explore the results at https://ebird.org/gbbc/places. Cass County Results: 57 Checklists Submitted 26 Species Reported total.

Towns represented Anita, Atlantic, Griswold, Lewis, Massena, and Wiota. More results: A Northern Harrier was seen, but notable usuals missing were Ring-necked Pheasant and wild turkeys in Cass County!

Summer Camps

The Cass County Conservation Board has joined with the Cass County ISU Extension Office to sponsor summer camps for the youth of Cass County. These camps were developed to give children a chance to have fun exploring and learning about nature. We felt that a refresh was due to our camps. We've changed our grade structure a little bit, and offerings. The kindergarten and 1st grade camps are now FREE and one session. Registration fee is still \$10 per student 2nd grade and up, includes a tote bag or lunch(6-8th gr camp), return with the fee to the Cass County Extension Office by the deadline. 



Live Plants

- Live plants from nursery will come as small plugs; cells are 5" deep x 2" wide at top or 4.5"deep x 2" Cone.
- Immediate care: remove plants from container as soon as possible and water thoroughly.
- Plant in the ground or a larger pot.
- Keep area around plants weed free, especially during the first growing season.
- Watering is important during the first growing season. Make sure the plants do not go dry for the first 3-6 weeks; water deeply to allow formation of deep drought and frost resistant roots. Once established, native plants can withstand extreme weather.




