## Winter of 1997/1998

4 Trumpeter Swans (most present in one day: 4)

*All entries refer to Schildberg Quarry unless otherwise marked*

### December 18, 1997-January 2, 1998

- **F74** is a female that hatched in 1996 by the Minnesota Zoo from an egg obtained in Alaska. It was raised in Spencer by a private individual and released at Spirit Lake in 1997. No other confirmed sightings until it reached Atlantic.
- **F75** was first reported as a male with the same information as F74. F75 again spent the winter in Atlantic during the winter of 1999/2000, it is paired with OF6. The pair was reported at Union Slough 2/21/00 and stayed until fall when they were reported back in Atlantic for the winter of 2000/2001. They were again reported at Union Slough on 3/14/01. F75 and OF6 were one of six successful nesting pairs of wild Trumpeter Swans in Iowa during the 2001 season. Five of the six eggs hatched on 6/5/01 at Union Slough. The DNR quickly realized that F75 is a female. OF6 was found shot near Union Slough in early November, 2001. F75 arrived back in Atlantic with all five of her cygnets for the winter of 2001/2002. Shortly after arriving back to Union Slough (late Feb, early March, 2002), F75 hit a power line and died. F75 (now known as "Faithful" for her consistent visits to Cass County) is now mounted and resides in the Cass County Conservation Board office.
- **F48:** DNR received this cygnet as a donation from a private game breeder in Iowa in 1994. This male was released at Spirit Lake in the spring of 1996. It has been spotted several times since its release: Riverton, IA 12/16/96; Liberty Missouri 1/7/97; Peculiar, Missouri 1/11/97 (It over wintered in the Liberty area); Spirit Lake, IA 4/12/97 inside the pen where it was released; Charles City, IA 5/3/97 where it met up with F21 (who joined these other birds in Atlantic, but had a fatal encounter with a power line.); Spirit Lake 6/6/97 (with his buddy F21) molted inside the pen where it was released; Atlantic was the next spotting site.
- **F35:** Eggs hatched by the NE Wisconsin Zoo in Green Bay, WI. This female was released at Union Slough (near Titonka, IA) in 1996. It wintered last winter in Woolstock, IA. It has also been seen in Armstrong IA 4/28/97; Union Slough 5/26/97; Smith Slough (Ruthven, IA) on 6/1/97 and spent the rest of the summer at Inham Lake near Graettinger, IA: Auburn, IA 11/19/97; next sighting was in Atlantic.

- **F75** first visited Atlantic during the winter of 1997/1998...see previous records for more details.
- **6F7** released in 1998 from Union Slough (by Algona), sex unknown.
- **OF6** hatched at the Minnesota Zoo from eggs that were brought in from Alaska. This male was released from Spirit Lake in 1998. OF6 paired with F75 in 1999. Upon leaving Atlantic, the pair was reported at Union Slough February 21, 2000 and stayed until fall, when they returned back to Atlantic for the winter of 2000/2001. OF6 and F75 were again reported near Union Slough on 3/14/01. They were one of six successful nesting pairs of wild Trumpeter Swans in Iowa in the spring of 2001. Five of the six eggs hatched on 6/5/01 at Union Slough. OF6 was found shot near Union Slough in early November, 2001.

- **OF6** first visited Atlantic during the winter of 1999/2000...see previous records for more details.
- **F75** first visited Atlantic during the winter of 1997/1998...see previous records for more details.
- **0619-24007 (later 8T7)** is a female that hatched near Star Lake in Wisconsin in 1992. She was released in Vilas County in far northern Wisconsin in 1993 (as green 28KN). 0619-24007 became 8T7 in February, 2003. 8T7 most likely stopped through Atlantic in February, 2002, as we reported a swan with a silver leg band and no other tags, with a group of three other unmarked adults. In 2003 8T7 mated with 6C7 (previously unmarked) at an unknown location and they arrived with one cygnet. 8T7 also spent the 2003/2004 winter in Atlantic.

# Winter of 2001/2002

12 Trumpeter Swans, 1 Mute Swan (most present in one day: 6, plus 1 Mute Swan)

## December 25, 2001 – February 13, 2002

F75 and her five cygnets

- F75 first visited Atlantic during the winter of 1997/1998...see previous records for more details.
- Ron banded four of the five young (one got away) in Atlantic on January 8, 2001. They were given the tags P78-P81.

- F75, P78 and P80, P81 and the unmarked young left Atlantic in the morning of 2/13/02, leaving behind P79.
- **P78** is a wild hatch (spring 2001) male (originally sexed as female) offspring of F75 and OF6. In 2002 it paired with H19. They mated at Union Slough in the spring of 2003 and produced five cygnets. P78 hit a powerline and died on November 25, 2003. On November 26, 2003 H19 and only one of the five cygnets arrived in Atlantic. The unmarked cygnet became 7C2.
- **P79** is a wild hatch (spring 2001) male offspring of F75 and OF6. P79 has been having trouble flying for long distances; it even fell from the sky and landed on it's back (in the water) at one point. Bob Voggesser reported that it won't eat the corn he provides. Ron, Bob and I kept in touch and then, for a few days he appeared to be doing better, flying and eating, but he (P79) quickly worsened and died at the quarry on 3/9/02.
- **P80** is a wild hatch (spring 2001) female offspring of F75 and OF6. Nine reports of P80 from after it's departure here through June of 2004 have this bird visiting several locations in Kossuth County including, Union Slough, Smith Lake and this one: P80 has paired with P16 and is alive and well near Union Slough 11/10/03 (Plum Creek Wildlife Area). On 12/20/04 P80 was reported with P16 at Moorland Park, just southwest of Fort Dodge. P80 arrived in Atlantic, with its mate P16, on 1/14/05 and stayed until 1/17/05. On 5/19/05 it was seen with mate P16 nesting at Union Slough, according to Rebecca Rasmussen, the Wildlife Biologist, they have been "trying to pull off a clutch the last couple of years". On 1/27/06 it was reported at Smith Lake (five miles north of Algona, IA) with P16 and three cygnets. The family was reported on 2/1/06 at Union Slough (near Algona). In the spring of 2006 the pair hatched six cygnets at Union Slough they were still at Union Slough on 7/20/06.
- **P81** is a wild hatch (spring 2001) female offspring of F75 and OF6. P81 died of unknown causes at Union Slough in early spring, 2002.

## January 27, 2002 - March 22, 2002

## February 24, 2002 - February 24, 2002 (for only 2 or 3 hours)

- **J44** was a female born at Ventura Marsh, near Clear Lake in the year 2000. She was released in Russel, IA.
- **J56** is a male born at a private site in Clinton, Iowa in the year 2000 and was donated. It was also released in Russel, Iowa on 5/24/01. It was reported near Witchita, KS on 1/10/02. It was again reported in Kansas, near Onaga, on 11/9/03.

## Spring 2002

### March 22, 2002

- On 3/22/02 Dave Hoffman placed two Trumpeter Swans on a pond owned by Blaine Behnken, two miles east and two miles south of the 148 and 92 intersection. Both swans are unable to fly and will hopefully produce young that will be released in the state. The female (H02) is four years old and has hit a power line and is unable to fly. The male (258 leg band) is eight years old and has successfully mated with a female that has passed away, his wings are clipped. Blaine volunteered his pond to help with the Trumpeter Swan Restoration Program in memory of Marty Bailey, Dustin McCurdy and Nate Downer. The male (258) was acting sick and was taken to a Spirit Lake rehabilitator and died of lead poisoning on 12/28/05.

## Winter of 2002/2003

- Bob Voggesser captured 7 swans in fence (4 unmarked) and Dave Hoffmann from DNR came down to tag them. They became:

- **8T7** first visited Atlantic during the winter of 2000/2001, see previous records for more details.
- **P78** first visited Atlantic during the winter of 2001/2002...see previous records for more details.
- One of the “unmarked”, not sure which of the six, has a silver USFWS leg band, but we can’t get close enough to read it.
- **2F7** is a female that hatched in 1997. She was released at Union Slough in April, 1999. She has paired with J43. 2F7 has been reported in Kansas, Missouri, Minnesota and several Iowa counties. In the spring of 2003 this pair mated and produced four cygnets just SW of Blue Earth, MN. According to the landowner, the pair had been there in the summers for a couple of years. 2F7 spent the winter of 2003/2004 in Atlantic with four cygnets and J43. One of her cygnets disappeared from the quarry area on 12/6/03 or 12/7/03. It is presumed dead. 2F7 and J43 returned to Atlantic again in the winter of 2004/2005 with two cygnets, it is assumed that they nested SW of Blue Earth, MN in spring of 2004. On 7/21/05 the pair was reported nesting with six young near Blue Earth, MN. 2F7 and J43 spent the winter of 2005/2006 at the Atlantic Quarry with two unmarked cygnets, one of which died on 12/30/05 after hitting a powerline, the other hit a power line on 1/13/06 and was then hit by at least one vehicle. The swan died that day. 2F7 and J43 spent the winter of 2006/2007 in Atlantic bringing 3 cygnets with them. The family left Atlantic on January 16, 2007 and were reported at Lake Waukomis (about 20 miles south of Kansas City) on January 26, 2007. 2F7 and J43 were reported to have hatched four cygnets at Pilot Grove WPA just SW of Blue Earth, MN in the spring of 2007.
- **J43** is a male that hatched in 2000 from an Iowa private propagator. It was released three miles NE of Ruthven, IA on 5/21/01. It has been reported in Sac, Kossuth, Boone, and Cass counties in Iowa. It is paired with 2F7 and in the spring of 2003 this pair mated and produced four cygnets just SW of Blue Earth, MN. J43 spent the winter of 2003/2004 in Atlantic. One of the cygnets disappeared from the quarry on 12/6/03 or 12/7/03. The cygnet is presumed dead. J43 and 2F7 returned to Atlantic again in the winter of 2004/2005 with two cygnets, it is assumed that they nested SW of Blue Earth, MN in spring of 2004. On 7/21/05 the pair was reported nesting with six young near Blue Earth, MN. J43 and 2F7 spent the winter of 2005/2006 at the Atlantic Quarry with two unmarked cygnets, one of which died on 12/30/05 after hitting a power line, the other hit a power line on 1/13/06 and was then hit by at least one vehicle. The swan died that day. J43 and 2F7 spent the winter of 2006/2007 in Atlantic bringing 3 cygnets with them. The family left Atlantic on January 16, 2007 and were reported at Lake Waukomis (about 20 miles south of Kansas City) on January 26, 2007. J43 and 2F7 were reported to have hatched four cygnets at Pilot Grove WPA just SW of Blue Earth, MN in the spring of 2007.
- **H19** is a female that hatched in 1999 from an Iowa private propagator. She was released at Union Slough on 5/13/00. It has been reported in Kossuth, Ringgold, Hamilton, Boone and Cass Counties in Iowa and also, Squaw Creek , MO on 3/22/01. She mated with P78 at Union Slough in the spring of 2003 and produced five cygnets that made it to flight stage, although, she arrived to the Atlantic quarry in the winter of 2003/2004 with only one cygnet, 7C2. Mate P78 is presumed dead. She left the quarry on March 13, 2004 alone, after she had not doing well for several weeks (attempted capture on March 8, 2004 was unsuccessful). H19 was reported at Union Slough on 11/17/04 and at Beemer’s Pond (5 miles west of Webster City) on 12/17/04. She was later reported at Union Slough on 6/1/05 with an unmarked mate and four cygnets. H19 was again at Beemer’s Pond on 12/1/05. On 6/2/06 it was reported at Union Slough with its unmarked mate and their three young (one of original four have died). They were still there on 7/20/06. On 5/20/07 it was reported with its unmarked mate at Union Slough (S. of Blacktop B14) and three cygnets.
- **P17** is a female that hatched in 2001 and came from the Memphis, TN Zoo. She was released at Union Slough on 5/13/02. She spent the summer of 2002 at Union Slough and visited Boone County before arriving here.
- **J35** is a female that hatched in 2000. She was released in Emmet County on 5/12/01. She has been reported in four of Iowa’s counties. On 2/26/03 she was found dead after being sick at the quarry.
- **J66** is a female that hatched in 2000. It was released nine miles west of Jolley, IA on 5/11/01. It has been reported in several Iowa counties and in Baschor, Kansas on 1/15/02.

- **8T5** is a male that first wintered in Atlantic in 2002/2003. 8T5 and 8T8 are a pair, after they left Atlantic on 3/15/03, they were reported in Rockwell City on 3/21/03. We presume that 8T5 is dead because it did not arrive at the quarry with 8T8 in the winter of 2003/2004.
- **8T6** is a male that first wintered in Atlantic in 2003/2003. 8T6 again wintered in Atlantic in 2003/2004. It is assumed that it was hatched in the wild in Wisconsin in 2001 or before. It's paired with 7C0 (previously unmarked) and nested at an unknown location (WI, perhaps) in the spring of 2003, producing six cygnets. 8T6 spent the winter of 2003/2004 in Atlantic. Two of the cygnets disappeared from the Atlantic quarry on 12/6/03 or 12/7/03. They are presumed dead. 8T6 and 7C0 returned to Atlantic in the winter of 2004/2005 with one cygnet hatching from an unknown location (Wisconsin ?). 8T6 and 7C0 again returned to Atlantic in the winter of 2005/2006 with five cygnets hatching from an unknown location (possibly have a sixth cygnet that arrived a few hours later than the others and is seen most often with this family, occasionally it's seen off by itself). There are no records of these swans anywhere besides Schildberg Quarry sightings. 8T6 and 7C0 spent the winter, with one cygnet, of 2006/2007 in Atlantic.
- **8T8** is a female that first wintered in Atlantic in 2002/2003. It is assumed that it was hatched in the wild in Wisconsin in 2001 or before. 8T8 and 8T5 are a pair, after they left Atlantic on 3/15/03, they were reported in Rockwell City on 3/21/03. 8T8 again wintered in Atlantic in 2003/2004. We presume that 8T5 is dead because she did not arrive at the quarry with 8T8 in the winter of 2003/2004. After leaving the Atlantic quarry on 2/26/04, 8T8 was later reported among 300 other swans in Monticello, MN on 3/12/04 and at Rebecca Park Reserve (Maple Plain, MN) on 12/3/04, it now seems to have an unmarked mate.

### **February 20, 2003...5 of the 13 headed north at 7:11 a.m.**

### **February 26, 2003**

J35 was found dead. It had been sick for about 2 months...7 remain

### **March 15, 2003**

All remaining swans gone (8T5, 8T6, 8T7, 8T8, J66, and two unmarked).

Bob Voggesser and I both had seen 3 at the quarry on 3/14/03 and by 3/15/03 they were all gone.

## **Summer 2003**

### **June 19 & 20, 2003**

Blaine Behnken's captive pair hatched four cygnets.

- The four were released at Mormon Trail Lake (Adair County) on March 29, 2004 and became: OH1, OH2, OH3 and OH4
- **OH1**, 2003 hatch year male of Blaine Behnken's captive pair, was released at Mormon Trail Lake (Adair County) on 3/29/04. It was found swimming on a small pond, unharmed one mile northeast of the lake on private land on 5/26/04. It was rescued by Dave Hoffman, DNR, and was later released at Anderson Lake (2 miles NE of Jewell, IA Hamilton Co) on 5/16/05. OH1 was next reported at Ada Hayden Heritage Park, Ames, IA Story Co. on 12/1/05. On April 14, 2006 it was reported on Boone River (Belk Mills Park) three miles northeast of Stanhope, IA in Hamilton County. On October 25<sup>th</sup> OH1 was reported at Pella Pond one mile east of Story City. On January 7, 2007 OH1 was reported in Olathe, KS at Neighborhood Lake located at 119 and Woodland roads. On March 4, 2007 it was reported on a 3-4 acre pond five miles southwest of Kearney, MO.

- **OH2**, 2003 hatch year male of Blaine Behnken's captive pair, was released at Mormon Trail Lake (Adair County) on 3/29/04. It was found dead (killed by an unknown predator) one mile northeast of the lake on private land on 5/26/04.
- **OH3**, 2003 hatch year female of Blaine Behnken's captive pair, was released at Mormon Trail Lake (Adair County) on 3/29/04. After unknown predators killed two of the four released swans, OH3 remains missing.
- **OH4**, 2003 hatch year male of Blaine Behnken's captive pair, was released at Mormon Trail Lake (Adair County) on 3/29/04. It was found dead (killed by an unknown predator) one mile northeast of the lake on private land on 5/26/04.

- 8T7 first visited Atlantic during the winter of 2000/2001...see previous records for more details.
- 2F7, J43, H19, 8T6, and 8T8 first visited Atlantic during the winter of 2002/2003...see previous records for more details.
- **7C0** (619-35435) is a female, banded in Atlantic on 1/22/04. It's paired with 8T6 and nested at an unknown location (WI, perhaps) in the spring of 2003, producing six cygnets. Two of the cygnets disappeared from the Atlantic quarry on 12/6/03 or 12/7/03. They are presumed dead. 7C0 and 8T6 returned to Atlantic in the winter of 2004/2005 with one cygnet that hatched in an unknown location (Wisconsin ?). 7C0 and 8T6 returned to Atlantic in the winter of 2005/2006 with five unmarked cygnets hatching from an unknown location (possibly have a sixth cygnet that arrived a few hours later than the others and is seen most often with this family, occasionally it's seen off by itself). There are no records of these swans anywhere besides Schildberg Quarry sightings. 7C0 and 8T6 spent the winter, with one cygnet, of 2006/2007 in Atlantic.

- **7C1** (619-35436) is a 2003 male, wild offspring of 8T6 and 7C0 (hatched at an unknown location, possibly WI) and was banded in Atlantic on 1/22/04. On 10/21/04 it was reported 5 miles SE of Fergus Falls, MN (Sec. 20, T132N - R42W) with 6C8. "They have been observed on 3 different wetlands in the past 5 days." 7C1 returned to Atlantic in the winter of 2004/2005, it appeared sick for several days and died on 1/1/05.
- **7C3** (619-35438) is a 2003 female, wild offspring of 8T6 and 7C0 (hatched at an unknown location, possibly WI) and was banded in Atlantic on 1/22/04. On 10/21/04 it was reported 5 miles SE of Fergus Falls, MN (Sec. 20, T132N - R42W) with 6C8. "They have been observed on 3 different wetlands in the past 5 days."
- **6C8** (619-35433) is a 2003 male, wild offspring of 8T6 and 7C0 (hatched at an unknown location, possibly WI) and was banded in Atlantic on 1/22/04. 6C8 was reported on approx. 4/9/04 at a private gravel pit in Sac County. Sec. 24, T87N, R36W. It was still there as of 4/23/04. On 10/21/04 it was reported 5 miles SE of Fergus Falls, MN (Sec. 20, T132N - R42W) with 7C1. "They have been observed on 3 different wetlands in the past 5 days." 6C8 returned to Atlantic in the winter of 2004/2005 and again in 2005/2006.
- **6C9** (619-35434) is a 2003 female, wild offspring of 8T6 and 7C0 (hatched at an unknown location, possibly WI) and was banded in Atlantic on 1/22/04,. It was spotted in Monticello, MN on 12/17/04 and arrived in Atlantic on 12/20/04. After leaving Atlantic on 1/17/05 it was next reported on a pond at the intersection of Fir Road and County Road F16 in Shelby County on 3/3/05. 6C9 was reported for one day only on 11/21/05 ½ mile east of Monticello, MN along with 323 other swans.
- **3C3** (619-34198) is a female, 2003 wild MN (just SW of Blue Earth) hatch, banded in Atlantic on 1/12/04, offspring of 2F7 and J43. She was later reported at Thorpe Park in Winnebago County, Iowa on 3/8/04 and then at Union Slough on 6/24/04. 3C3 returned to Atlantic in the winters of 2004/2005 and 2005/2006. It is paired with 5C5. Bob V. reported that this swan left the quarry on 1/27/06 and then returned again on the morning of 2/1/06, later that day it was reported at Union Slough. It again was reported at Union Slough on 5/25/06 with 5C5 and they were still there on 7/20/06. On November 10, 2006 3C3 arrived with 5C5 and 3C4 and spent the winter of 2006/2007 at the Schildberg Quarry. On March 5, 2007 3C3 was reported in Dallas County with 5C5.
- **3C4** (619-34199) is a female, 2003 wild MN (just SW of Blue Earth) hatch, banded in Atlantic on 1/12/04, offspring of 2F7 and J43. She was later reported at Thorpe Park in Winnebago County, Iowa on 3/8/04. 3C4 returned to Atlantic in the winter of 2004/2005. 3C4 was reported in a corn field four miles north of Clear Lake with one adult and one cygnet on 4/26/05. 3C4 was reported at Union Slough on 6/7/05 with 7C4 and three unmarked cygnets (not a nesting pair, just a group of five swans). 3C4 was again reported at Union Slough on 8/2/05. 3C4 returned to Atlantic for the winter of 2005/2006. On 6/2/06 it was reported at Union Slough and was still there on 7/20/06. On November 10, 2006 3C4 arrived with 5C5 and 3C3 and spent the winter of 2006/2007 at the Schildberg Quarry. On 3/7/07 3C4 was reported at Severe's pond 3 miles south of Nora Springs in Floyd County, IA with 8K9, 6H9 and 7H6.
- **7C4** (619-35439) is a female, 2003 wild MN (just SW of Blue Earth) hatch, banded in Atlantic on 1/22/04, offspring of 2F7 and J43. 7C4 returned to Atlantic in the winter of 2004/2005. 7C4 was reported at Union Slough on 6/7/05 with 3C4 and three unmarked cygnets (not a nesting pair, just a group of five swans). 7C4 and 3C4 returned to Atlantic for the winter of 2005/2006. 7C4 hit a power line on 1/13/06 and landed near Highway 83. It then walked back to the quarry and was unable to fly off of the quarry until 1/19/06. It seems to be improving each day. 7C4 was reported at Hanlontown Slough (Hanlontown, IA) with 5C0 on 3/22/06 (also present were P05 and 5H5). 7C4 was reported at Union Slough on 5/13/06 with 5C0. They were still there on 7/20/06. 7C4 arrived with 5C0 and spent the winter of 2006/2007 in Atlantic.
- **7C2** (619-35437) is a 2003 male, wild offspring of H19 and P78 (nested at Union Slough), banded in Atlantic on 1/22/04. He was later reported at Thorpe Park in Winnebago County, Iowa on 3/8/04, at Smith Lake (North of Algona) on 5/17/04 and then arrived at Beemer's Pond for the winter (near Webster City) on 11/11/04. After leaving Beemer's Pond on 1/4/05, it was not reported again until 11/25/05 ½ mile east of Monticello, MN with approx. 350 other swans. By 12/1/05 it had arrived at Beemer's Pond, near Webster City and by 12/5/05, 7C2 had arrived in Atlantic.

- **J23** is a 1999 female hatchling from the Jackson, MS Zoo. She was released at Union Slough on 5/13/02. She was reported at Union Slough on 7/11/02 and 11/11/02. The next reported sighting was here in Atlantic. After leaving here on Feb. 2/26/04, she was reported on 3/14/04 on a pond near Kossuth Co Road B14, one mile east of Hwy 169 (in the Burt, IA area).
- **6C7** (619-35432) is an adult male, banded in Atlantic on 1/22/04.
- **3C5** (619-34200) is a 2003 male offspring of 8T7 and 6C7 (assuming a wild nest in MN), banded in Atlantic on 1/12/04. 3C5 either hit a powerline or was hit by a vehicle 5 miles SW of Gibbon in Sibley County, MN on approx. 12/17/04, she was in poor condition with four broken ribs and was taken to Hinshaw's Rehabilitation Center. On 1/28/05 DNR's Dave Hoffman released him at the Schildberg Quarry where it is eating well and taking a few small flights, but not socializing with the other 13 swans. All other swans left the Atlantic Quarry that winter in early to mid March but 3C5 stayed and appeared to have a broken wing. By the end of March 2005 it was showing signs of improvement and was not seen again.

On 1/18/06 5H2 was reported at Marais des Cygnes NWR (Pleasanton, KS, Linn County) with 5H5, 2H8 and one cygnet. On 2/13/06 5H2, 5H5 and 2H8 along with two other adults and a juvenile were reported in the southern part of Miami County, Kansas (south of Beagle, KS) and have been there since 2/1/06. It was last reported in the area on 2/27/06. In early June, 2006, 5H2 joined 6K2 and 5K8 at Lake Anita, in Cass County, IA. 5H2 was next reported at the intersection of 665<sup>th</sup> St and Keystone Rd in Cass County, Iowa from Oct. 29<sup>th</sup>-November 1, 2006 along with swan 6K2.
- **5H3**, 2004 hatch year of Blaine Behnken. Released at Lake Anita (Cass County) on April 6, 2005.
- **5H4**, 2004 hatch year female of Blaine Behnken's captive pair, was released at Lake Anita (Cass County) on 4/6/05 and next was found dead on December 10, 2005 one mile southeast of Nevada, Missouri. The X-ray showed no signs of broken bones or gun shot wounds. There were two surviving swans with it when it died, one unknown and one was 7T2.
- **5H5**, 2004 hatch year male of Blaine Behnken's captive pair, after being released at Lake Anita on 4/6/05, was last reported at Lake Anita on 8/5/05 and was next reported with 5H2 and 2H8 near Butler, MO (Bates County, 50 miles south of Kansas City) on 12/26/05 and had been there for at least a week. On 1/18/06 5H5 was reported at Marais des Cygnes NWR (Pleasanton, KS, Linn County) with 5H2, 2H8 and one cygnet. On 2/13/06 5H5, 5H2 and 2H8 along with two other adults and a juvenile were reported in the southern part of Miami County, Kansas (south of Beagle, KS) and have been there since 2/1/06. It was last reported in the area on 2/27/06. On 3/22/06 it was reported at Hanlontown Slough (Hanlontown, IA north of Clear Lake). On 5/25/06 it was reported at Union Slough and was still there on 7/28/06. 5H5 spent the winter of 2006/2007 with an unmarked adult at the Schildberg Quarry in Atlantic, leaving Atlantic on March 9, 2007. On March 17, 2007, it was reported in a field along Co. Rd. 16 just south of Co. Rd. 6 in Steele County, Minnesota with its mate 6H9. On 3/28/07 it was reported with its mate 6H9 in Downtown Mill Pond, Red Cedar River in Austin Steele, MN.

- **P16** is a male 2001 hatch from the Memphis, TN Zoo. He was released at Lizard Lake six miles southwest of Gilmore City in Pocahontas County, IA on 5/22/02. He paired with P80 in approx. 2003. The pair spends most of its time at Union Slough. They spent the winter of 2003/2004 at Moorland Pond (West of Fort Dodge) and were again at Moorland Pond on 12/20/04, before arriving in Atlantic with mate P80. The pair was reported nesting on 5/19/05 at Union Slough, according to Rebecca Rasmussen, the Wildlife Biologist, they have been "trying to pull off a clutch the last couple of years". On 6/1/05 P16 was seen "on its old nesting spot alone, suspiciously on the "lookout" at Union Slough. On Friday evening, 1/13/06, I received several calls of Trumpeter Swans dead and injured out by the quarry. After several accounts and versions of what happened, it has been determined that four of the 22 swans that were flying hit the powerlines near Highway 83. It seems like there was a lot of traffic at the time and it is still unknown exactly how many swans were hit by cars, anywhere from one to three of them. The good news is that three of the four survived the incident! After hitting the power lines, all four swans landed on or near Highway 83. One swan flew back to the quarry with no injuries, one (7C4) walked back to the quarry and has been improving some each day, one landed right in the middle of the highway and was hit by at least one vehicle and did not survive. That young, unmarked swan, belonging to 2F7 and J43 was their second one lost to power line collision this winter (both young that arrived at the quarry with them have now died after hitting power lines, the first death occurred on 12/30/05, and they are left with no young, after hatching six near Blue Earth, Minnesota last spring). Finally, the last swan was injured and captured that night. It was taken to Kay Neumann to be rehabilitated and luckily had no internal injuries and no fractures or broken bones. On 1/19/06 it was tagged and released back at the quarry (7K0), a young swan belonging to 7C0 and 8T6. It can fly for a few hundred yards and lands again.

- 8T6, 2F7, and J43 first visited Atlantic during the winter of 2002/2003...see previous records for more details.
- 7C0, 6C8, 7C4, 3C4, 3C3 and 7C2 first visited Atlantic during the winter of 2003/2004...see previous records for more details.
- **5C5** is a 2003 hatch year male from West Bend, IA. He was released near Clear Lake, IA on 4/20/04 and in the year of 2004 was reported in the following Iowa counties: Cerro Gordo, Winnebago, and Hamilton. It spent the winter of 2004/2005 at Beemer's Pond near Webster City (Hamilton Co). It was then reported on 2/11/05 in Dows, IA (Franklin Co.) and on 3/11/05 one mile south of Swaledale, IA (Cerro Gordo Co.). It is paired with 3C3. Bob V. reported that this swan left the quarry on 1/27/06 and then returned again on the morning of 2/1/06, later that day it was reported at Union Slough. On 2/17/06 it arrived back at the quarry in Atlantic without 3C3. On 5/25/06 it was reported at Union Slough with 3C3. They were still there on 7/20/06. On November 10, 2006 5C5 arrived with 3C3 and 3C4 and spent the winter of 2006/2007 at the Schildberg Quarry. On March 5, 2007 5C5 was reported in Dallas County with 3C3.
- **7K0** is 2005 hatch year, unknown sex, belonging to 7C0 and 8T6. 7K0 arrived, unmarked, at the Atlantic Quarry with its parents and four other unmarked cygnets. An additional cygnet joined the group at a later time. On 1/13/06 7K0 hit a power line along Highway 83. It was taken to Kay Neumann to be rehabilitated and was released again on 1/19/06. It could only fly for a few hundred yards until 1/21/06 when it circled over the quarry twice before landing. On 1/23/06 it flew off of the quarry for the first time. It has still not been accepted by the other 20 swans. On 1/27/06 it flew off the quarry with its parents and other siblings and was reported on 2/5/06 at a pond near the intersection of county road N28 and I-80 in Cass County. On 2/6/06, it was reported back at the Schildberg Quarry and appears to have been completely accepted by the others. On 5/30/06 it was reported approximately one mile south of Fergus Falls (I-94/Co Rd 1 exit).

February 5, 2006

The family of: 7C0 and 8T6, along with one cygnet 7K0, and four of their other unmarked cygnets, as well as one unmarked "adopted" cygnet and 6C8 (a 2003 offspring of 7C0 and 8T6) were reported at a pond near the intersection of county road N28 and I-80 in Cass County. One of the unmarked cygnets has been there since approximately 1/27/06 when the group left the Schildberg Quarry and it appears to be unable to fly. This lone cygnet swan had been reported there several times in the week, but the first report of the rest of the group joining it was on 2/5/06 and it again remained behind after the others left on 2/6/05. On 2/10/05 it seemed to have improved (Bob Voggesser had fed it) and it flew over to the Schildberg Quarries.
