As we slowly move into the spring things are beginning to pick up in the outdoors. April 8 kicks off the Iowa youth turkey season, with the 4 other seasons following, with the end of 4th season the 14th of May. Fishing has already started picking up here at Cold Springs with people venturing out on our nicer days. This fishing will only continue to improve as it starts getting warmer. Also, with warmer temperatures and hopefully some more moisture, morel mushrooms should be showing up again very soon, a word of caution if looking for mushrooms during the turkey season on land that may have turkey hunting going on, please wear blaze orange clothing so you stand out and help avoid any possible accidents. The campground at Cold Springs will be open and ready for you to come stay with us and enjoy the beautiful oak and hickory trees as they start to leaf out for the year. The Canada geese are beginning to nest on most of the bodies of water and I'm hearing wood ducks every day at Cold Springs. The Trumpeter Swans that live near the Outdoor Classroom have returned to nest for another year as well. Our Standup Paddleboard programs will return this year they will be on the last Saturday of every month (exception of July), Ending Labor Day Weekend with that Saturday Sept. 2nd. We only have 5 currently, so you must pre-register for your spot! Anyone under 16 must have a parent with them at all times. You must also weigh less than 250 lbs. We have a frequent camper card program- ask our staff! Camping coupon books are now available! \$150 for 11 nights of camping at Cold Springs Park good until Oct 31, 2024. Results of 2023 Great Backyard Bird Count

Overall it was a great year for Iowa in the Great Backyard Bird Count (GBBC). It was a strong year for checklists in other parts of the state. Iowa overall was higher in species and in checklists happening, but we had a great showing of 35 checklists and 37 species. We got beat out by the largest counties in the state: Polk, Story, Johnson, Scott, Woodbury, Black Hawk, Dubugue, and In this Issue: Linn counties in that order. We got 9th in checklists but we were tied for 18th in species count! We beat Dallas county in checklists but not in species count. With the new eBird system the record keeping is by **Upcoming Events** county so I can not really tell you anymore the species reported for each town unless we record them, but Cass county as a whole. Iowa as a whole had 110 species reported and 1079 checklists! United Summer Camps! States reported 671 species and 196,679 checklists.





The GBBC is a global bird count sponsored by the National Audubon Society and Cornell Lab of Ornithology. Collectively, we found 7,538 species of birds—2/3 of the known 10,960 species we share the planet with. More than 200 countries came together to share bird sightings, making our global submission map light up for four consecutive days. Since 2002 the Cass County Conservation Board has advertised this bird count throughout the county encouraging citizens to participate. Typically participants submit their checklists on the internet, however, for those that are not comfortable using computers, the Conservation Board collects the data and enters the checklists for them. You can explore the results at https://ebird.org/gbbc/places. Cass County Results: 35 Checklists Submitted 37 Species Reported total

Towns represented Anita, Atlantic, Griswold, Lewis, Marne, Massena, and Wiota. More results: American Robins, Sharp-shinned Hawk, and wild turkeys made an apperance in Cass County! Only 2 Trumpeter Swans individuals were counted at one time in Cass County, near Anita.


2023 Nature Tots Preschool Summer Programs

• Live plants from nursery will come as small plugs; cells are 5" deep x 2" wide at top or 4.5" deep x 2" Cone.

- Immediate care: remove plants from container as soon as possible and water thoroughly.
- Plant in the ground or a larger pot.
- Keep area around plants weed free, especially during the first growing season.


• Watering is important during the first growing season. Make sure the plants do not go dry for the first 3-6 weeks; water deeply to allow formation of deep drought and frost resistant roots. Once established, native plants can withstand extreme weather.
