

The Cass County Board of Supervisors met at 9:00 a.m. with all members present: Steve Baier, chair, Stephen Green, John Hartkopf, Mark O'Brien and Frank Waters. Agenda upon motion by Hartkopf, 2nd by O'Brien was approved. Minutes of August 31, 2020 upon motion by Waters, 2nd by Hartkopf were approved.

Three county citizens (Dale Retallic, Doug Sheppard and Daryl Karstens) asked the board to consider what can be done to mitigate safety and environmental problems on roadway south of Atlantic due to traffic resultant of the opening of a quarry south of Atlantic west of Hwy 71 on Lansing Road. After due discussion: County Engineer will be meeting with representatives of Schildbergs and looking into establishing a lower speed limit on roadway which includes a portion of 620th St. Board plans to consider establishing a new speed limit at next session on September 15.

A HAVA CARES grant was given to the State to help Iowa respond to the coronavirus for the 2020 election cycle. A subgrant is available to the counties individually based on the number of precincts.

The State has determined CARES Fund allocations and Cass County has been allocated up to \$162,734.90 for COVID-19 related expenses. First claim for reimbursement will be for period of 03/01/2020 thru 07/31/2020. Collection of documentation needed for submission of first claim is not yet complete.
