

Butterfly Surveys!

Cass county is participating in butterfly surveys through the Iowa Butterfly Survey Network. Our surveying route is at the Outdoor Educational Classroom. The Iowa Butterfly Survey Network (IBSN) is located at Reiman Gardens with the ultimate goal of educating Iowans about butterflies, while at the same time encourage people to take an active role in conservation. To that end IBSN conducts research using volunteer citizen scientists of all skill levels to collect data for yearly population surveys of butterfly species in the state of Iowa. Volunteers are trained in survey techniques specifically developed for butterflies. Contact us if you are interested in learning more! We are closing in on our second year doing the surveys out at the Outdoor Educational Classroom. We have conducted 13 surveys in that time with 21 different species found so far!

Birding Workshop Wrapup! In 2021, we held 4 building better birder public programs. This was a partnership with Kelly J. McKay, at BioEco Research and Monitoring Center. Major funding for this program was provided by the Resource Enhancement And Protection – Conservation Education Program (REAP-CEP). These programs were held at Sunnyside park in Atlantic and Outdoor Educational Classroom. During some of these of workshops we offered birding hikes and those were held at our Outdoor Educational Classroom near Massena. We saw/heard over 31 species during those workshops. Most notable or new for us records would be Northern Saw-whet Owl and wood ducks!

Park Updates

As summer is chugging right along many of us are thinking about cooler temps, and fun things to do outside this fall. Our upcoming hunting seasons will be here before we know it, and now is a great time to get some things in order rather than waiting until the last minute. Get those firearms and bows sighted in now as well as start doing some scouting for the upcoming seasons. Our first season to open this fall is dove season on September 1st, the county has planted sunflower food plots for dove hunting at the West Nodaway area and the Hitchcock House. The deer and drought have been tough on our sunflower plots this year so hopefully they produce a decent crop for the doves. Small game hunting kicks off next with rabbit, and squirrel season opening September 4th. Any of our county owned public hunting areas can produce rabbit and squirrel action for those interested. Youth deer season opens up on September 17th. Get those kids out practicing shooting now so they are comfortable with their weapon of choice, and ready to hit the woods. Once again most of our county public hunting areas can provide an opportunity to harvest a deer. That brings us to October and the archery opener on October 1st as well as youth pheasant on October 23rd and regular pheasant opener on October 30th. Hopefully the roadside counts in August will tell us numbers are up, and there will be a good number of pheasants to chase after this fall. As always BE SAFE and have an enjoyable fall at our county managed public hunting areas.
